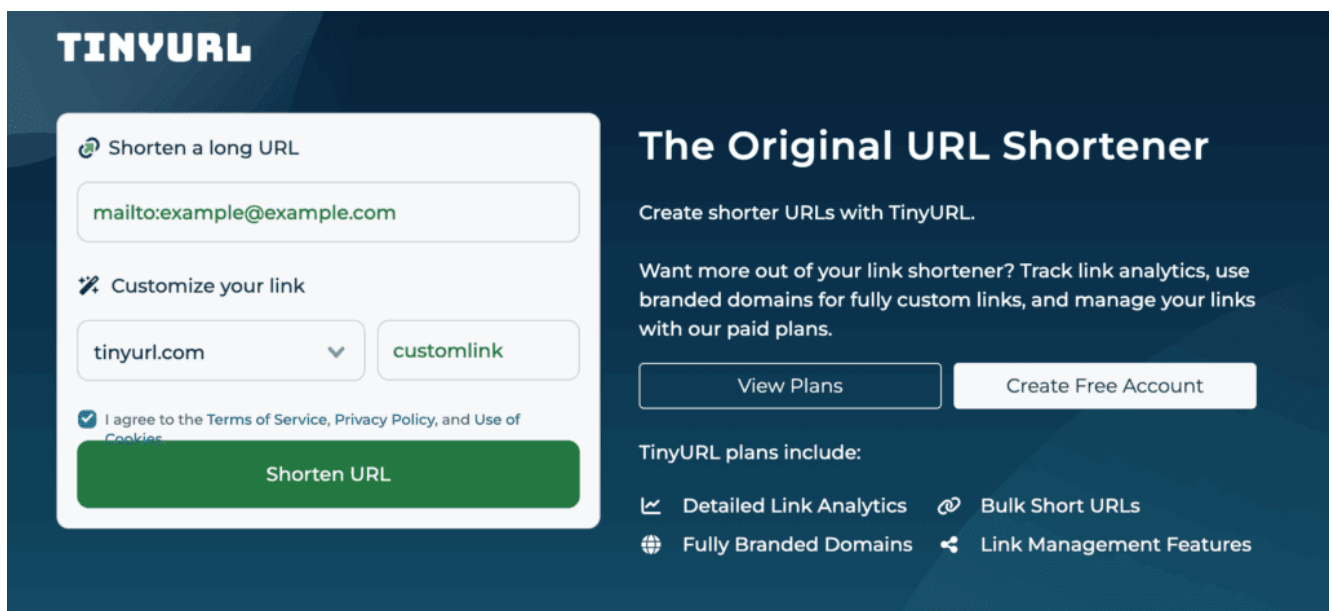


Mailto: links

Jlive does not yet natively support mailto:email@email.com links. This means in your Event Description or Messages you can not automatically trigger an email to be sent. Jlive requires a link that actually takes the user to a website. But there is a simple workaround that fixes this.

1. Go to TinyUrl.com.
2. Enter “Mailto:youremail@email.com” and some short URL of your choice
3. Generate LINK
4. Use this link in Jlive
